Attendance of museums and galleries.

Museums are incredibly interesting places where anyone could relax, learn new things, find ^{gr.} an inspiration, get closer to ^{gr.} the art or history. The attendance of ³⁵ galleries is an important aspect of cultural behaviour and habits of people living in England.

This chart ^{150x} shows the number of visits to national museums and galleries in England for three separate years. The number of visits to British Museum, National Gallery and Tate Gallery obviously raised twice from 2013 to 2017 (including 2015). However, the rate of visits to Natural History Museum and Science Museum got much more lower. ¹⁰⁰ The attendance of Natural History ~~and~~ ¹⁰⁰ reduced from 3,7 mln to 1,9 mln, which means 2,8 mln. The attendance of Science Museum reduced to 2,2 mln. To draw on these ¹⁰⁰ datas, we could think that this might be accounted with raising in people's preferences in art and reducing in their interests in sciences such as physics, biology, anthropology, e.t.c. Furthermore, talking about popular among tourists places, we could assume that British Museum, National Gallery and Tate Museum have ¹⁰⁰ its ^{their} own attractiveness for tourists. Every tourist want to take a good selfie with a beautiful Museum ¹⁰⁰ or ^{an gr.} extraordinary picture in a Gallery ¹⁰⁰ ~~or~~ in the background.

I can give a few recommendations to the museum boards what could be done to increase people's attendance of Natural History Museum and Science Museum. First of all, try to attract people with science, make them be interested with your theme: explain how nature and physics' law ¹⁰⁰ work in real life and ¹⁵⁰ what influence they do on our lives. Secondly, give people chance to attend your museum freely: do an open-door day, for example. You also ¹⁰⁰ can do sales for buying tickets.

Making a conclusion, I can make a statement about attendance of museums and galleries²⁰⁵ in England. Summarizing the data, we could see that British Museum, National Gallery and Tate Gallery are more popular than Natural History Museum and Science Museum. Nevertheless, museums and galleries are still worth to attend and people are getting more interested in it.³³⁷
